Children who are ready to start primary school in September 2020 must apply from Tuesday 7^{th} January.

Closing Date for P1 applications is 12 noon Thursday 30th January 2020.

Any applications received after this time and date will be considered as late.

All applications must now be completed online. Details are outlined on our school website. Click on Parents and then Open Night /Admissions

Please note that all P3 children will require their Baptism Certificate. Can you also please ensure all P4 and P7 children have supplied a Baptism Certificate to the School. We will check our records and let you know if we have a copy.

We have been asked by Fr Alexander that all certificates are received by school 2 weeks prior to the date of the Sacrament. He has advised that he will be asking to see them and those who have not supplied certificates may not receive the Sacrament.

Parents should contact the Parish Office where their child was Baptised in order to obtain the certificate. Be aware there will be a processing time for certificates.

Please Remember

Children who are not attending Breakfast Club must not be in school before 8:45am as they are on school premises unsupervised. Breakfast Club opens at 8:15am and is available until 8:45am. School starts at 9am. Anyone arriving after 9:10am must report to the school office and they will be marked absent for the morning session after 9:15am. Absences for any reason must be followed by a written note of explanation following your child's return to school. These are checked by our school EWO (Education & Welfare Officer). Letters regarding attendance will be sent home where the total attendance is below 90% for the first term. 90% attendance during the first term, means 8 days missed – almost two weeks of school! There are quite a number of children coming to school each day without anything to eat at break time. This is mostly when children are attending school dinners, so please remember to include a healthy snack for break on these days too. P1 continue as normal, but unfortunately we won't be able to give anything out to other children.
